

## Statistical Institute of Jamaica Press Brief Labour Force January 2014

April 30, 2014

The main findings of the January 2014 Labour Force Survey, conducted by the Statistical Institute of Jamaica (STATIN) are presented below. The reference week for this survey was **December 15-21, 2013.** The 2011 Population Census distribution was used to derive all the estimates for this survey.

- In January 2014, the number of persons in the **Labour Force** was 1,305,500, an increase of 7,900 (0.6%) higher than the 1,297,600 recorded in January 2013. The male labour force increased by 8,000 (1.1%) from 708,700 in January 2013 to 716,700 in January 2014, and the female labour force was relatively unchanged with 588,900 persons in January 2013 and 588,800 persons in January 2014.
- There were 1,130,500 **employed persons** in January 2014, which was 20,500 more than the 1,110,000 recorded in January 2013. For males, it increased by 10,500 (1.7%) to 644,000 and for females it increased by 10,000 (2.1%) to 486,500.
- The **Employment Rate** of 86.6 per cent in January 2014 was an increase of 1.1 percentage point compared with 85.5% in January 2013. The Employment Rate increased for both males and females over the period. For males, it increased by 0.5 percentage point, moving from 89.4% to 89.9%, and for females it increased by 1.7 percentage points, moving from 80.9% to 82.6%.
- In January 2014, 775,000 persons were classified as being Outside the Labour Force. This represents a decrease of 2,300 (0.3%) when compared to 777,300 in January 2013. In the same period, the number of males Outside the Labour Force declined by 5,200 (1.7%) moving from 309,400 to 304,200 and females increased by 2,900 (0.6%) moving from 467,900 to 470,800.
- In the **Employed Labour Force**, the **Occupation** group '**Clerks**' increased by 9,400 persons (10.2%), from 92,100 in January 2013 to 101,500 in January 2014. Significant increases in employment were also observed in the group, '**Skilled agricultural and Fishery Workers**', which increased from 194,400 persons in January 2013 to 202,600 persons (4.2%) in January 2014. The group '**Service Workers and Shop and Market Sales Workers'** had the largest decline for the period, moving from 233,900 to 228,800 in January 2014 resulting in a decline of 5,100 (2.2%) persons.
- The largest increase in the number of employed persons by Industry occurred in the groups 'Real Estate, Renting & Business Activities' and 'Wholesale & Retail, Repair of Motor Vehicle & Equipment'. The number of persons employed in the group 'Real Estate, Renting & Business Activities' increased by 8,600 (13.8%) persons while the group 'Wholesale & Retail, Repair of Motor Vehicle & Equipment' increased by 6,700 (3.0%) persons.

- The number of **Unemployed** persons decreased by 12,400 (6.6%) moving from 187,500 persons in January 2013 to 175,100 persons in January 2014. The number of unemployed males decreased by 2,500 (3.3%) and females by 9,900 (8.8%) for the same period.
- The **Unemployment Rate** for January 2014 was 13.4% compared to 14.5% in January 2013. In the same period the unemployment rate for males and females declined moving from 10.6% to 10.1% and 19.1% to 17.4% respectively.
- Unemployment rates among youths aged 14-24 years was 33.3% for January 2014. This was a decrease of 3.2 percentage points when compared with 36.5% in January 2013. The male unemployment rate for youths was 27.6% compared to 41.1% for females.
